We are living a time of grace for the Marist Institute. On the threshold of the new centenary, God offers us new horizons, keys for reading, so as to look at our history and mission with gratitude and openness of heart and mind. We are preparing this new beginning by means of several processes, among others: the implementation of the document Evangelizers among the Young, the experience of the International Assembly of the Marist Mission in Nairobi, the preparation of the General Chapter, the revision of the Constitutions, the New Models, etc. These place us in a new attitude in the face of the needs and opportunities of the Marist Life and Mission.

HAITI: HOW IS THE ISLAND A MONTH AFTER HURRICANE MATTHEW?

A month after hurricane Matthew hit the southwestern part of the island of Haiti, the situation of thousands of displaced people remains critical. External humanitarian aid is insufficient and, when it arrives, it is slow and spaced out in time, due to the challenges in its distribution, as well as to the state of the roads.

Today the island is experiencing the worst humanitarian crisis since the earthquake of 2010, in which an estimated 50,000 children lost their homes and now live in temporary shelters. It is also estimated that approximately 100,000 children have not been able to return to school.

The Marist world in Haiti

Marist Brothers who reside in the island have been working tirelessly to serve and help our communities. In a first moment, it was difficult to assess the damage due to the difficulty of communication with the communities of Jérémie, Latibolière, Dame-Marie and Les Cayes, whose inhabitants have lost everything. Later, they realised that the three Marist schools on the island had been severely damaged, with fallen ceilings, broken windows, ruined walls, destroyed solar panels and broken or missing water tanks. In addition, many houses of the affected populations, including those of the same brothers and their families, had damages that varied between small and very severe. In the most serious cases, some houses were completely destroyed and others are still uninhabitable, due to damage to the foundations, walls, ceilings and water tanks.

Status of the "Solidarity for Haiti" Campaign - Mexico Occidental

It will be one month this week since the "Solidarity for Haiti" campaign began. Support of the Marist schools of the Mexico Occidental province has been requested by means of the campaign in order to join their communities to this work of solidarity with the Haitian people.

In this context, we have already managed to send some



aid to our brothers, with the aim of beginning the most urgent work. We are very proud to communicate that the campaign has had an echo both nationally and internationally, with the participation of the schools of our sister province, Mexico Central, as well as Fundación Marista Solidaridad, Educación, Desarrollo (SED) and Marist International Solidarity Foundation Onlus for the benefit of children (FMSI) who are also supporting us with rebuilding schools in Dame-Marie and Latibolière.

However, to date we have raised just 15% of the budget needed to fix the Marist works in Haiti and ensure that our children can continue to study.

Reconstruction work on the island

Wood, nails and metal sheets have been purchased to date through the money that has been raised so far in order to begin the reconstruction of the schools in Dame-Marie and Latibolière, and the necessary local labour has been recruited. - Prioritisation of needs in the region for the New Models initiative to be presented in the extended council session in December 2016
- Evaluation of the workshops on New Horizons and planning the second phase

There were also moments of personal reflection to try to identify the Institute's calls, such as internationality, rights of children and youth, Marist youth ministry, the relationship between brothers and laity, accountability and sustainability, and leadership formation in the light of the New Models Project.

The atmosphere was described as "open and with a spirit of fraternity." Luca facilitated the meeting's sessions on the New Models Project.

The Conference of Superiors of Africa and Madagascar entrusted the African Mission Commission the responsibility of animating and leading the process of implementation of the New Models of Animation and Governance project in the continent.

GENERAL HOUSE: COURSE "AMANECER" (DAWN OR DAYBREAK) IN ROME

The course for the Third Age in Spanish and Portuguese, for Brothers from 70 to 80 years of age, which was held from September 1 to October 31, has been finished.

The 18 participants of the course "Amanecer," which was directed by Brothers Landelino Ortego y Javier

Ocaranza, included 15 Marist Brothers and three Marianist Brothers from Spain, Mexico, Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru, Brazil, Portugal and Mozambique.

One of the participants said: "Soon we knew one another and gradually created profound fraternal bonds of union, in the style of the first Chris-

tians, with the desire to profit to the maximum of this course which is offered to us".

The course was centered on the anthropological axis, the spiritual and the Marist axis.

During the anthropological axis, the

participants discussed the knowledge of an elderly person, integral health, maturity in religious life and inter-personal relationships.

The spiritual axis covered the personal history of salvation, the following of Jesus and the commitment, the mission of the elderly in the Bible and prayer and centrality in Christ.

The Marist axis dealt with the Charism of Marcelin, Marian spirituality, the vision of the Institute by the Superior General, Brother Emili Turú, the Year La Valla and the celebration of the Bicentenary. They also discussed the mission of the Laity in the Church and in the Institute, as well as the re-

lationship of the Brothers with the Laity.

The participants visited Rome and its surroundings such as Cerveteri, Albano Lake, Frascati, Viterbo and Bolsena. They also made some pilgrimages to Assisi, Subiaco, the Catacombs of San Calixto, the Shrine of Divino Amore, the Hermitage (France) and ended the course with a Papal audience in the Vatican.

Br Alberto was born in Palacios de la Sierra, Burgos, Spain. His first appointment was to Cuba. He has spent most of his life in El Salvador, especially in the city of Santa Ana.

Those who know him well describe him as a simple brother, warm and with a big heart, very much aware of what is happening around him, a man of a deep spirituality, much appreciated by his ex-students.

Br Emili, in the letter he sent to express his good wishes, told Br Alberto that "your fidelity to your vocation is, at the same time, a wonderful sign of the FIDELITY of the Lord to you and to each one of us".

NEW ZEALAND: MARISTS ARE SAFE DESPITE EARTHQUAKE AND TSUNAMI

It has been confirmed that the 7.5 magnitude earthquake and tsunami that struck New Zealand on Monday, Nov. 14, has not affected the Marists of Champagnat in the country.

The four schools run by the Brothers and the additional 22 schools in the Marist Education Network were not damaged either.

The earthquake that killed two people took place in a relatively unpopulated area, affecting mainly the town of Kaikoura, which has around 3,600 residents and 1,000 tourists.

"The major damage is to the roads and bridges in the area although a lot of buildings will need to be rebuilt and repaired," Brother Kevin Wanden told the general house press office on Nov. 14. "There are a lot of aftershocks with over 800 today



alone, some of these are quite large being over 5 on the Richter scale," he added.

Two earthquakes shook the city of Christchurch in 2011.

There are a total of 81 Brothers and three novices in the Pacific District with 58 of them living in New Zealand.

PASTORAL ASSEMBLY OF THE MARIST PROVINCE BRASIL CENTRO-SUL

From Oct. 26 – 28, Brothers and laity of the Brasil Centro-Sul province gathered in the pastoral assembly in Curitiba.

Under the theme "a new beginning: discipleship, mysticism and mission" and under the theme "... And he walked with them (Luke 24:15b)," the encounter gathered over a hundred participants, representatives of different areas of provincial mission.

The assembly's main objective was to give new impetus and vigor to the provincial pastoral ministry. The process was divided in three phases: a pre-assembly, the pastoral assembly and the post-assembly. The first phase was dedicated to studying the reality by visiting all the units to listen to pastoral agents. From this list came ideas that helped establish the pastoral horizons of regional meetings.

The second phase, the assembly in itself, was a moment of celebration, of studying and of preparation of the ministry guidelines at provincial level. Brother João Batista,



in charge of the provincial ministry, manifested that the "assembly was an occasion to turn one's gaze back to the evangelizing action of different units, with the goal of revising the processes and advancing in the Marist mission."
