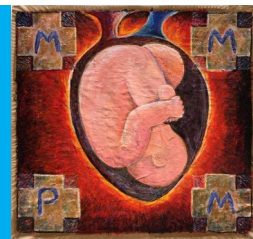

By John McCrae

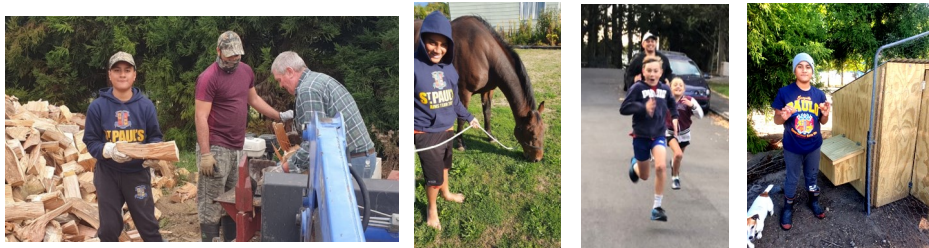
In Flanders fields the poppies blow

Dear Parents and Boys

"We are afflicted... not crushed; perplexed... but not to despair; struck down... but not destroyed." (2 Corinthians 4:8)

Whilst the learning *conditions* remain different for the vast majority during Level 3 what will *not* be different is the learning *expectations*. Teachers have been busy preparing for what will be a crucial learning term and the expectations on our Marist Men is to be ready.

Details on Level 3 transition:

- The nation will move out of Level 4 Lockdown to Alert Level 3 next Tuesday 28 April
- Level 3 permits schools to open for students up to Year 10 on Wednesday 29 April

However, the Government is asking all students that can remain at home do so, and continue with their online learning at home.

To clarify for our Sacred Heart families:

- We will continue to run online learning at home for Year 7 to Year 13 students
- Due to work commitments some families will be unable to have their sons at home. These families can send their sons to school to be supervised as they complete their online learning programme.

In summary, the Ministry of Education has asked us to emphasise that the best option is to keep children at home to continue their learning if possible. Please be assured if this is not possible for your family, your son will be well cared for at Sacred Heart.

We will update you on further relevant details as we receive more instruction from the Ministry of Education.
