The closure of "Marist Project." The young man Alex who stayed with us from 18th of March finally went home to be reunited with his family on 27th July.

29th July. Government imposed stricter laws to prevent the spread of corona virus. i.e., not more than two persons gathering, no dining in all food courts

and restaurants. Business is suffering. But that is so far the only way to take precaution.

31st July. Government disqualified at least 12 Democrats members from being the candidates for the election in September. Reasons: The government is trying to settle down those who voice out the problem instead of solving the problems. The political situation in Hong Kong for sure will not be the same any more. We will see more arrests and disqualification soon.

In August, with no public Mass, we had our morning prayer and communion every morning in our chapel. A lot of renovation and repair works for the school were done. Dusty and noisy. But a new look after that.

10th August. Mass arrest of young democrats and revolutionists, even the media tycoon Jimmy Lai of Apple Daily, under the National Security Act which was imposed last July the 1st.

Community:

We cleaned rooms and got rid of old junk. Br. Chin and I take turns in maintaining the garden, our vegetable, fruits and flowers. We received a kitchenware for free to be installed in our dining room. We made changes and also renovate our kitchen. The dining room and the kitchen will have a new look by October. Due to the pandemic, we have a small-scale birthday celebration for Br. John Chin, on 11th September. We invited the Principal and Vice Principals to join us for lunch. Fr. Stephen Lo, a Focolare, offered to say Mass for the community on Sundays. We are more than happy to have that.

Our helper, Ms. Joe Chow, stayed with us for a few days. Her son, a flight steward, just got back from London. She was afraid she might get infected; so, she asked to stay in the community for some time. We were delighted; for we did not have to worry about the meals.



Since September 2019, when our last cook, Ms.

Neddy (the sister of Br. George Valle) left for Canada, we were looking for a cook. We did employ and signed a contract with one. But unfortunately, due to social unrest and the pandemic, our new cook is still in the Philippines. Daily Mass resumed on the 2nd of October. We attend Mass in the morning at St. Teresa Church.

Schools:

Summer online lessons continued in order to catch up with the lost hours of face-to-face teaching and learning during the suspension of classes. Zoom and Google Meet are among the favorites. On 17th August, the IMC of SFXS endorsed Mr. Yue Ming Wai as the Third Vice Principal of the school.

On 18th August, under typhoon signal 3, the New Teachers induction was held separately, in the morning at SFXS with 4 new teachers and in the afternoon at SFXC with 7 new teachers. Aside from giving the routine information, Br. John Chong shared about the Marist Style of Education. New School Year 2020-21 begins on the 1st of September but with the suspension of classes, everything was done through online program. The morning prayer was prerecorded; it was prepared by Br. John for the week during the suspension.

The EDB announced classes to resume on the 24th of September for F1, F5 and F6 and on the 29th of September for all other forms. But all schools needed to strictly follow the prevention measures. Only half day of schooling (from 7:55 am to 1:00 pm). No activities were allowed after school. Br. John Chong has joined a year program on "Catering for Diverse Learning Needs" offered by the Education University of Hong Kong. He will need to attend lessons on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 9:30pm at learning central; at times, there will be online sessions.

6th October. The SFXC IMC has set up a selection board to plan, to select and to interview candidates for New Principal of SFXC. Mr. Iu our current Principal will retire by the end of this school year.

Singapore Community

Singapore



During the early part of the Covid 19, we had just a normal life. We attended Mass every day and reported to school for work. When the cases in Singapore increased every day, the government started to implement restrictions. Masses were suspended; schools and shops were closed; no visitors were allowed, and the movements were very limited. Everyone was encouraged to stay home; only essential shops or stores were open. Since I am the youngest in the community, I did all the purchasing of essential things that the community needs, especially buying our food and "what have you." I also prepared the food for the Brothers. I missed my daily routine especially attending Mass, the presence of children, the teachers, and the parents. However, the pandemic taught me how to be prayerful and creative, as well as to manage my time fruitfully, especially in preparing the teaching aids of K1 and K2 children while the school was closed. When the government lifted the circuit breaker, the school opened, and other shops also

opened. However, the precautionary measures remain tight even up to this time.



Community life was strengthened since, we have enough time for each other. There was no hurry. The community prayers continued unless some of the Brothers are sick or incapacitated. When that happens, I pray alone. I spend at least 30 minutes for my contemplation which the Provincial Chapter inspired me. Br. Thomas and I always eat together, and I accompany Br. Joseph when he eats his meals especially lunch and dinner. Br. Joseph has permission to eat earlier than us. However, during the circuit breaker, the Brothers have lots of spare time to spend. Br. Thomas and I have regular exercise.

We walk around Champagnat house and CK

compound. Br. Thomas targets 3,000-4,000 steps a day. While I target 6,000-7,000 steps in at least 30-45 minutes. Most of the time I do manual work/maintenance around the property, planting vegetables and flowers.

Before the circuit breaker, I shared my vocation story and the Life of Saint Marcellin Champagnat to the Champagnat Kindergarten Teachers and Staff, and the MSHS Secondary 1 Catholic Students and Catholic Teachers. When the circuit breaker was implemented, everything was done online.




LAITY DESK




