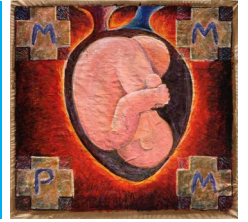

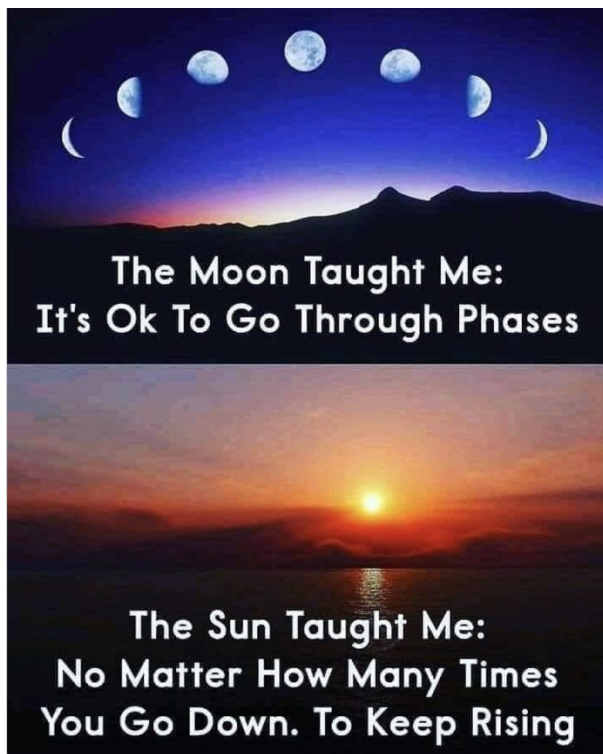


Family Mass and Old Boys' Memorial Mass
