

UPDATES:

The Marist of Champagnat generously responded in the appeal of the secretary of the Holy Cross Parish in Calumpang to immediately come to the aid of the victims of fire in Purok Saeg, Calumpang, General Santos City, Philippines. The fire happened in the afternoon of November 3, and it affected more or less 1,111 individuals. The initial number of the affected families is 600 and they are temporarily accommodated in the evacuation centers in Calumpang.









The Philippine Sector Finance Commission (FinCom) met on 5th November at the Marist Province Center in Lagao to update and discuss the sector 's financial reports, and the economic sustainability amidst the pandemic.



MARIST BROTHERS' WINERY SAVED THEM FROM JAIL

The last three foreign Marist Brothers to be expelled from Red China reported on their arrival at Hong Kong that they were not put in jail because the Communists considered their winery "a work of production."

The Reds wanted the products from the Brothers' famous Chala vineyards that had once supplied Mass wine for missions in all parts of China. At one time, the Brothers reported, the Reds took 80 cases of wines, liqueurs and champagne to ship by airplane to their embassy in Moscow. The Communities often took the Brothers' winery products for exhibits in different parts of the world to show what good wines were made in China.

But even their winery didn't save the three French Brothers from expulsion. Arriving at Hong Kong were Bro. Nizier Morel, 75, who had been in China since 1898, and was in Peking during the Boxer Rebellion; Bro. Joseph Felicite Planche, 66, who when his older brother was killed in 1900, entered the Marist Order, taking the same religious name, and came to China to replace his brother in the religious work; and Bro. Nicola Kopp. They report that 72 Chinese Marist Brothers are still in China.
