On 2nd December last year Zimbabwe welcomed the New Horizons delegation, Bro. Mark Omede—New Horizon International Program Manager from Rome, Italy and Bro. Francis Jumbe—New Horizons Regional Co-ordinator Southern Africa from Malawi, Lilongwe. The main purpose of their visit was to launch the New Horizons program in Zimbabwe. Zimbabwe, warmly welcomed them and the launch took place at Nyanga High School Marist Brothers. They shared with clarity the main thrust and objectives of the project and how it will benefit the young people especially the underprivileged students. We are grateful to the visit and knowledge that was imparted on us following their visit. As a country we pledged to continue implementing the programmes as per New Horizons guidelines and help our young people especially in the areas of Child Safeguarding and best leadership practices. We were delighted to know that not only Zimbabwe, but our Province of Southern Africa was chosen to do pilot projects which will hopefully will be implemented by the Marist Brothers in other Provinces of our Institute at global level.

04 Reinforced the Education system at institutional level in terms of its capacity to advocate children rights

During the Horizons workshop the learners clearly cited some of the challenges they face in their respective schools such as:

1. Walking long distance more than 10km to school.
2. Lack of clean water for drinking.
3. Inadequate learning resources, such as essential textbooks, computers, mobile phones for online lessons.
4. Lack of proper boarding facilities resulting in using unsafe bush boarding facilities.
5. Lack of knowledge about child safeguarding issues.



## **INTERNATIONAL NEWS ON CHILD SAFEGUARDING**

### **WEST AFRICA PROMOTED WORKSHOP ON SAFEGUARDING THE RIGHTS OF CHILDREN AND VULNERABLE ADULTS**

The Marist Province of West Africa organized a workshop on Safeguarding Children from the African perspective on the 10th of December 2021 at the Provincial House in Accra. The workshop was facilitated by Dr. Nora Nonterah. Thanks to the Provincial Commission, Brothers from the other countries were able to follow the workshop via Zoom.

In her presentation, Dr. Nora Nonterah identified and explained the various forms of abuse children suffer in Africa. She noted that some of the abuses are usually seen as taboo – hence the tendency to protect the relationship between the families and communities concerned at the expense of the victim. To safeguard children, she encouraged that there is a need for sex education in our schools, policies for safeguarding children, training, openness, dialogue and above all cooperating with the local authority whenever there is an issue regarding child abuse.

Dr. Nonterah blamed some abuses on wrong theological interpretation of suffering which in most cases supported such acts. In her opinion, 'Jesus' suffering on the cross is to liberate us from operation and injustices, cruelty and pain. She added, 'we must not suffer for God – He suffered with us; he suffers to liberate us'. She maintained that encouraging victims to unite their sufferings with the cross of Christ should not be entertained in anyway.



In her conclusion, she remarked that many people think that child abuse is not an issue in Africa considering our traditions and cultures. She called on participants to be advocates of child rights and to be at the forefront in protecting and safeguarding the rights of children. She encouraged the brothers above all to show good pastoral care towards the children who have been entrusted to them. **Article extracted from: [www.champagnat.org](http://www.champagnat.org).**

### **COMPACT ON EDUCATION**



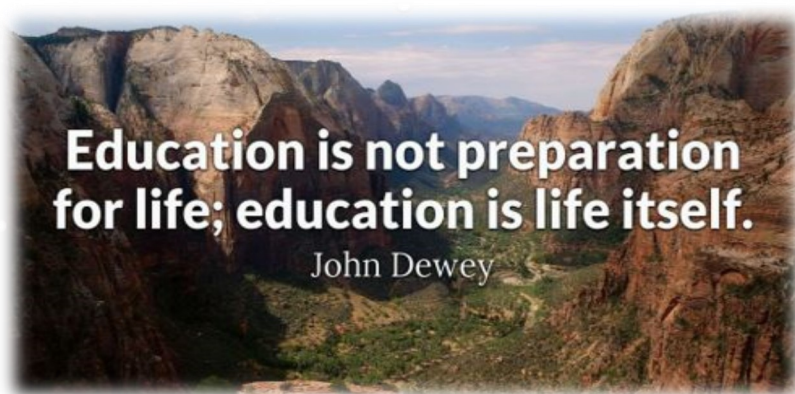


## WHERE WE ARE STATISTICS OF THE MARIST MISSION IN THE WORLD

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of December 2021, Brothers Leonard Brito and Emmanuel Mwanalirenji celebrated 25 years as Religious Brothers in the Institute of the Little Brothers of Mary (Marist Brothers). Indeed, it became a December to remember. The event took place at Marist Brothers Kutama College (Zimbabwe). Kutama College is within the Diocese of Chinhoyi, about 80 km from Harare the capital city of Zimbabwe.

The friends and family members of Brother Emmanuel and Leonard attended the ceremony. The Provincial Superior of the Marist Province of Southern Africa (Brother Norbert Mwila) as well as the Marist Brothers of Zimbabwe witnessed the anniversary. However, due to COVID 19 restrictions, attendance was limited to not more than hundred people while social distancing, sanitization and wearing of masks was strictly observed.

The Holy Mass was presided over by His Lordship, Reverend Tapuwa Mupandasekwa (The Bishop of Chinhoyi Diocese). During his homily, the Bishop commended Brother Leonard and Brother Emmanuel for continuing to say YES to their call to religious life. The Bishop said that religious life is a life of love and joy. The joy of religious life is infinite and cannot be likened to the joy drawn from the guitarist entertaining people because once the guitarist stops playing his guitar, the joy ceases whereas the joy of being a religious is immeasurable and endless. Bishop Mupandasekwa also encouraged the Brothers to keep alive the charism of our founder Saint Marcellin Champagnat. As teachers by profession, the Brothers were fortified to keep reflecting on what makes them unique and different from any other teacher. Concluding his homily, the Bishop acknowledged the noble works done by the Marist Brothers within the Diocese of Chinhoyi and across the world.

In his speech, Brother Norbert Mwila (The Provincial Superior) expressed his gratitude to the parents of Brothers Brito and Mwanalirenji for their generosity by offering their sons to the service of God and Humanity. Brother Norbert also congratulated Brothers Brito and Mwanalirenji and encouraged them to remain faithful to their call as apostles of the youth.

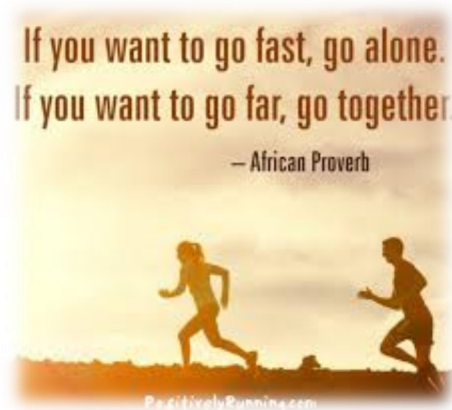
