

Matariki is a star cluster that appears in the early morning sky in New Sealand during the midwinter months. It is known also as Pleiades or the Seven Sisters. Its appearance in the early morning sky brings the past year to a close and marks the beginning of the new year.

Friday 24 June 2022 was the first public celebration of Matariki as a national holiday. Most of our current observances originated in other parts of the world. This is our first 'homegrown' celebration as is a time for;

- Remembrance Sonouring those we have lost since the last rising of Matariki
- Celebrating the present Gathering together to give thanks for what we have
- Cooking to the future Cooking forward to the promise of a new year
