# THIRD ANNUAL GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CHAMPAGNAT MARIST ASSOCIATION

he third Annual General Assembly of the Association of Champagnat Marists of Canada (AMCC), made up of brothers and lay Marists from the District of Canada, took place on April 22 at the Maison Mariste "Champagnat" in Iberville. At the opening of the meeting, in a spirit of prayer and unity, the participants asked the "Good Mother" to support and accompany them in the adventure of ensuring the Marist presence in Canada.

During the Assembly the members proceeded with the election of the new Administration Council of the Association of the Marists of Champagnat (AMCC). They were elected: Fernando Castro as presi-



dent, Claude Prégent as vice president, Edith Villalon Cordova as secretary, Sllesica del Cid as treasurer, and brother Gilles Lacasse, Ronald Leblanc and Jorge Cuerno as administrators.

Among the activities carried out, the members of the AMCC reflected on the challenges that await them, such as working to create better communication, and sharing activities with the different areas where the



### general administration

- On Sunday, the ongoing formation course "looking beyond" began in Manziana, aimed at Brothers (between 60 and 65 years old) who are finishing a stage of their life in certain apostolates (school, academic or other) and begin the stage of retirement; and also for those who look to the future seeking to be present and be Marists in new mission fields, according to their possibilities and age. The program will conclude on July 22. On Saturday the group will visit the General House and meet with the General Council.
- This week, the General Council continues its plenary sessions. During these days, it receives information and reflects on various topics related to economics and administration. The sessions of the legal structures "Gier" and "Fraters" will be held with a regular Council. Ideas will be discussed in relation to the preparation of the next General Chapter.
- On Monday, the General Council met with the General Council of the Marianists to share on some topics.
- On Tuesday, Br. Luis Carlos, Vicar General, participated in the webinar organized by the Marist University Network.

- This Thursday, the Marist Global Schools Network team promotes the second edition of the webinar "Building the Global Pact in the Marist School". Brothers Ernesto Sánchez, Luis Carlos Gutiérrez and Ben Consigli will participate, together with the team of the Secretariat for Education and Evangelization.
- Throughout the week, from Monday to Friday, the directors of the Solidarity Secretariat are meeting online with the 5 Working Groups to which the Marist Solidarity Network is dedicated: Solidarity Education, Children's Rights, Social Work, NGOs/Foundations, and Ecology.
- Br. Pepe Sanchez, director of the Secretariat for Education and Evangelization, and Javier Llamas, project manager of the Champagnat Global School Network, will be present at Friday's meeting of the consultation committee of the Global Champagnat Network.
- Brothers Juan Castro, Michel Maminiaina, and César Rojas began this week at the General House to prepare for next year's course, from February to November, in Manziana for new Marist formators.

Marists are present in the district. And, to make the Marist charism known, above all, through the creation of new fraternities and the consolidation of those that are functioning.

Among the objectives, the members hope to be able to assume the mission of service and commitment in the "Maisonnette à Iberville", and the "Mission of Santa Teresa d'Avila" in Montreal, place of life and apostolate of the Bonne Mère fraternity, and to seek other opportunities for involvement in the different Marist contexts of the district.

Likewise, they hope to continue streng-

thening ties with the global network of the Institute, and reflect and live together with the Marist Institute, the next Stage of the Forum on the Lay Marist Vocation. And depending on the possibilities, to be able to participate in different activities with the Arco Norte Region and the Inter-American Network of Marist Spirituality.

The last two years of high school were spent in a secular school After graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree, he began a process of vocational accompaniment with a religious sister. For two years, he was in a process of vocational accompaniment at the same time as his university studies, taking a degree in Spanish

at the Universidad Pedagógica de San José. He later met the Marist Brothers, who had a school called San José, in the city of Maracay, Venezuela. Upon meeting them, he began his formal process of accompaniment with Br. Carmelo San Millán. He completed his aspirantship at Colegio San José in the city of Maracay, Venezuela. He then did his postulancy in the city of Loja, Ecuador. In 2016, he entered the Interprovincial Novitiate La Valla, in Medellin.

Br. Alexnnys continued his Marist vocation in the Scholasticate Community in Bogotá. In 2022 he obtained his degree in Religious Education from La Salle University in Bogota, Colombia.

### 23RD ANNUAL MARIST YOUTH GATHERING

ver 250 Youth from all the USA Marist schools, young adults, faculty, and members of the youth group from Canada and Mexico gathered at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, New York, from 26 to 29 May, for the 23rd annual Marist Youth Gathering (MYG2023). The theme this year was "Shine Like the Son" launching the third year of the province prayer theme set by Br. Dan O'Riordan which is focused on Jesus.



The participants came from the Roselle Catholic, St. Joseph Regional, Mount St. Michael, Archbishop Molloy, Central Catholic, Marist Chicago, Monsignor Pace, Christopher Columbus, St. Joseph Academy, Marist Catholic – Eugene, Marcellin Champagnat (Canada), St. Mary Magedeline Parish, (Blue Island, IL), St. Francis of Rome Parish (Bronx, NY), St. Michael Parish (Union, NJ), and the Province of Mexico Occidental.

The Liturgy this year was led by Father Richard LaMorte, who previously was the Campus Priest at Marist College before he retired.

Following the opening welcome ceremony, each school set up a booth at the annual "School Fair", where students went around collecting items from each school present and took the opportunity to know each other. To end the first night of MYG2023, Br. Robert Dittus led the group in a night prayer, inviting each person to write the name of someone who has been a light for them in their school communities on a post-it.

The second day, Ash Johnson, (Guidance Counselor at Mount Saint Michael Academy) and Br. Luis Ramos (Archbishop Molloy High School) presented the first keynote of the weekend, discussing questions such as 'Who is Jesus and how did we become aware of and connected to him?', 'How have we felt Jesus' love in our lives?' and 'Is there a right way to love Jesus?'

Students had the opportunity to attend four different workshop sessions throughout the weekend. Workshop topics included: Embracing Diversity Through Synodality, The Art of Spiritual Discernment, 'Joy, Grace, and Mary', Our Marist Journey, Recharging Our Energy so we can SHINE!, Shine like the Moon, Prioritizing the Priorities!, Fuel to SHINE!, The Son is shining, why aren't you?, Called -a panel discussion, Music to Shine, and Leading a Group of People. On the other hand, the Marist Young Adult team attended a session called 'Marist Always' and the adult team was offered a session on Our Marist DNA.

The thirs day, on May 28, Br. Ryan Richter presented the second keynote and facilitated a panel discussion centered on how we have made Jesus known and loved in our lives and difficulties we have faced living out this mission. Panelists included Fernando Machado (Christopher Columbus High School), Maureen Hagan (USA Province), Karam Hallak (former Marist Young Adult), Br. Terry (Marist College), and Celeste Solis (Saint Joseph Academy).

Following the program for the 23rd annual Champagnat Games the Students were split into 12 teams! Stations included Izzy Dizzy Relay, Ultimate Frisbee, All Aboard, Water Balloon Volleyball, Alaskan Baseball, Key Punch, and Human Ladder & Ring Toss. In keeping with tradition, Matt Fallon was the winner of this year's games.

On May 29, during the final keynote presentation of the Gathering, Dr. Darius Penikas (Principal – Archbishop Molloy High School) and Br. Steve Schlitte (Principal – Mount Saint Michael Academy) spoke to the Youth Marist about taking what they learned from the weekend back to their respective schools to continue to SHINE LIKE THE S-O-N; theme that inspired the 23er Marist Youth Gathering.

# FMSI PROMOTES PROJECT MANAGEMENT TRAINING

he Marist Foundation for International Solidarity (FMSI) held on June 1 the first of the five meetings on the theme "Project Cycle Management".

The first module of the course, addressed by Andrea Rossi, Director of FMSI, focused on the theme: "The logical framework – Results, indicators and monitoring". The course gave the participants the opportunity to receive intermediate level training on Project Cycle Management, in order to improve the effectiveness and sustainability of projects and the Marist Mission in general.

The course was organized by FMSI together with the Secretariat of Solidarity, the Solida-

rity Heart Network and the NGO SED (Solidaridad, Educación y Desarrollo), and it had the active participation of 55 members of the Solidarity Heart Network, brothers, parents, sisters and lay Marists in the world, members of SED and other organizations and congregations.



The objective of this training initiative is to reinforce the skills of the participants on the preparation of project proposals, the execution and management of projects, financial sustainability, and fundraising planning, in accordance with international requirements.

#### PROVICE OF MEDITERRANEA

## **BONDING OF LAYPEOPLE TO THE MARIST CHARISM**

or several years a formative itinerary (Being Marist Today) has been developed in the Mediterranea Marist Province, in terms of vocational discernment, with personal accompaniment, for those people who feel called to deepen their vocation as Marists, from their state of lay life. This proposal raises the possibility of making a public commitment to bond to the Marist charism, which is recognized by the Mediterranean Province.



A group of 11 lay people (Anabel Pérez, Alfredo García, Ana Gómez, Mª Carmen González,

Pepe Camposo, Danilo Farneda, Juanvi Gordillo, José Albalá, Antonio Ángel Flores, Koki and Manu Gómez) from the Spanish area of the Province have followed a personalized path in which they have delved into the three dimensions of the Marist charism: spirituality, fraternity and mission. And as a result of this discernment, they have responded to the initiative of the Spirit, the Ruah, to live as lay Marists.

They expressed their response in the framework of the celebration of the Eucharist held on June 4, the feast of the Holy Trinity, on the eve of the feast of Saint Marcellin Champagnat. A celebration full of life, loaded with meaning, with a multitude of symbolisms that helped them to get closer, in a deeper way, to the experience that was wanted to be expressed and shared. At the end of the Eucharist, a simple fraternal banquet was shared with all those who joined the festive celebration.

Welcomed by the Marist community of Granada, in the south of Spain; and accompanied by their families, companions of their fraternities, lay communities, Marist Brothers, and the full Provincial Council, the 11 lay men and women made a promise to live their lay vocation in the style of Mary and Champagnat, pledging to continue the Marist charism in the places where they develop their life and mission. First with a common formula and then with a personal formula, each of them expressed in what concrete way they understood the link to the charism, from a deep experience of God, sharing life with other Champagnat Marists; and at the service of the Mission among the most vulnerable children and youth.

Brother Aureliano García, Provincial of the Mediterranean, accepted their commitments and imposed a simple cross with three violet inlays, a common symbol that the Provinces of Europe have adopted for this sign of lay bond to the Marist charism. In the words he addressed to the newly bonded lay people, and to the entire assembly, he expressed his gratitude for this experience of fraternity, for the Marist vocation that brothers and lay people share today, and for the new time that they are already living in the family charismatic.

As expressed at the beginning of the Eucharist, "As Marists, in the image of the Holy Trinity, we want to deepen the lay-brother communion. A communion that supposes sharing the same following of Jesus, the same radicalism of the Gospel, the same faith, the same baptism, the same charism. Communion becomes vocational complementarity, mutual enrichment, and a joint search for a greater vitality of the charism for today's world. And so, in communion and as a family, as sisters and brothers, we are building the Marian face of the Church."

We remember what is mentioned in number 12 of the document "Gathered around the same table. The vocation of Champagnat's Marist Laity": "We Lay Marists are Christian men and women, who in the course of our life have listened to the call of God to live the charism of Champagnat, and, from our lay state, we respond to it." We give thanks to the good God and our Good Mother, Mary, for this great gift to the Marists of Champagnat in Mediterránea, and the whole world.

The Eucharist is a feast, which had many festive, solemn and emotional moments. One of the most special was the unveiling of a plaque commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Pascua de les Avellanes that has been fixed on one of the walls of the monastery. And, as Easter Eucharists are not Eucharists without music, the group Ubuntu was in charge of providing the music for the celebration, with significant songs of the celebrations of these past years. "You will be Champagnat today", "Good Mother", "Beatitudes" or "Som Testimonis de Resurrecció" resounded once again within the walls of the church loved by so many generations.

The Eucharist gave way to a shared meal, during which the party continued, also with Ubuntu, and a repertoire of new and old songs. The farewell song reminded the attendees that "Goodbye is not forever" and encouraged them to return to celebrate every year the resurrection of Christ.

## TRAINING ON LEADERSHIP AND MARIST CHARISM



four-day training session on 'Leadership and Marist Charism' took place at the Mahatamana Center in Antsirabe, Madagascar from May 30 to June 2, 2023. The training, promoted aimed to strengthen the skills and knowledge of the leaders in the Marist schools, such as the Headmasters and Deans of Studies. They were joined by the Provincial Counselors, making a total of 22 participants.

The trainers were Mrs. Carmen Murata and Mr. Renato Darui, from the Province of Brasil Centro-Sul, who are experts in leadership, strategic planning and

accountability, and Brother Goyo Linacero, General Council as Assistant to the Econome General and Project Manager of the Strategic Plan of the General Administration, who shared his insights on the Marist charism and spirituality.

The training was an initiative promoted by the General Administration as a response to the Stategic Plan of the General Government that ask to promote sustainability at all levels of the Institute, fostering responsibility, internal solidarity and interdependence.

The training was interactive and partici-

patory, with group discussions, presentations and reflections.

The participants expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to learn from the trainers and from each other. They also felt more motivated and confident to carry out their mission in the seven Marist schools in Madagascar, which serve around 10,130 students. They hoped to apply what they learned to improve the quality of education and the promotion of Marist values in the Province of Madagascar.
