Brother Luis Carlos Gutiérrez, the Vicar General of the Marist Brothers, paid a visit to Malawi in June this year. He travelled to Malawi to attend the closing ceremony of New Horizon project in Lilongwe. He took this opportunity to visit some Marist schools and communities, including Marist Secondary School in Dedza.



Marist Secondary School environment was transformed into a kaleidoscope of colours on the day the Vicar General arrived. His welcoming ceremony featured a spirited display of numerous activities. Poetry, amapiano and traditional dances characterized the event. The *gulewamkulu* (A masked traditional dance mostly practiced among Chewa people in Malawi, Zambia and Mozambique) drumming rhythm and synchronized movements of the *Makanja* (a type of Gulewamkulu) dancers captured the attention of everyone present.

As the students showcased their talents, [Brother Luis Carlos Gutiérrez](#) watched with admiration, recognizing the effort and passion that went into their preparations. It was evident that the cultural expression through the *gulewamkulu* dance not only entertained but also fostered a sense of belonging, identity and pride among the students.

Brother Luis addressed the students, expressing his gratitude for the warm welcome and commended students for their dedication and commitment to their cultural heritage. He also spoke to them about the **Marist pillars of education: presence, simplicity, family spirit, love of work and in the way of Mary**. He further told the students to be proud being part of a global Marist family.

After meeting the students, the Vicar General also met both teaching and support staff of the school. During the get-together, Brother Luis thanked the teaching and support staff for the effort they put in the holistic education of the students. Furthermore, he encouraged them to keep the good spirit.

MALAWI MARIST BROTHERS TIMELY AID FREDDY CYCLONE VICTIMS



Malawi was strongly hit by tropical freddy cyclone

in March this year 2023 and many people in southern region were heavily affected by the angry cyclone. Many people of good will in and outside Malawi came out with assorted items to support our brothers and sisters who were affected by the cyclone including the catholic church in Malawi.

Marist Brothers in Malawi did not just fold their hands watching suffering but rather went in haste like Mary to one of the affected areas in Zomba district at Mayaka Community Day Secondary School (MCDSS) donating relief items worth 15 million Malawi kwacha to 500 boys and girls who were affected by tropical freddy Cyclone. The development was part of the recovery plan by the Malawi Marist administration which was joined by Malawi Red Cross Society (MRCS).

The items donated on the material day included blankets, sugar, cooking oil, meal flour, soya pieces, plastic buckets, sanitary pads and clothes. The staff members, parents and students' council applauded the Marist Brothers through Brother Daniel Banda who engineered the whole process of delivering items that the timely aid would help students to attend classes which was not uneasy

THE MATOLA EXPERIENCE: A true-life story.

Somos Testemunias da essas coisas Act: 5-32



We can't share our Matola experience without talking about the "pope" for most of the Brothers, Brother Mansoa was their novice master or community member in some communities within the Southern African Province. But for Matola novitiate, Brother Mansoa was the "pope". Brother Mansoa could not conclude a serious conversation without mentioning the Pope. We were well informed about the Pope and the Church. When I remember Brother Mansoa in our formation courses, which we never failed no matter how hard those tests were to come, even if one did not study, we all passed, who could fail the test from the "pope?" I could still see him standing in front of us holding a yellow Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church (YOUCAT).

Those who never shared our novitiate would think we were too comfortable to be in the novitiate because we had our best of time there. The door for Brother Mansoa was open 24 hours, closed for some few hours for those whose gods had gone for a vacation. The duty of a novice was to meditate on God and how we could do a well-animated Marial prayer that would eliminate the misfortune on you as you approach the "pope". Better still, if ever the "pope" followed you and patted your shoulder in applauding you, one did not need to re-meditate or even re-pray when going to meet the "pope" for "**ka something**," you got the whole heavenly favours on you. For Brother Mansoa a novice was a "young holy man" whose weaknesses was solely to become a good Brother.

If at all one struggled at the door of Brother Mansoa, that was the indication that your Marial prayer and the animation of the weakly prayer wasn't too creative and the "pope" was not so much impressed. Anyway, we never prayed to impress the "pope" but the novitiate is a place where we learnt the skill of praying and a good way of conducting prayers. Brother Mansoa was the formator whose duty was to help us come out of the novitiate fully baked, in as far as prayer life was concerned. One thing I cannot forget to mention is that Brother Mansoa also said, "**NEVER SAY A BAD THING ABOUT ANY-ONE**".

The untold story about Brother Mansoa was that, we never lacked "**ka something**" for our Sunday walks. No one went walking without "**ka something**" for a bottle of water. We spoke our broken Portuguese to anyone with confidence. Sometimes we landed in water, either on our way going or on our way back. Occasionally, we came back running because punctuality was our moto. Others could not endure the smoke that came with the incense after a Sunday walk during adoration. There was really an inordinate **JOY IN SERVING THE LORD**.

Buying bread of the week, was another exciting Matola experience one would wish to have if they were to redo their novitiate. There was quite countless exposure that came with the **Aniane padaria** experience. Long live Motola, long live our novitiate, long live Marist Brothers, long live the spirit of Champagnat.

OBITUARIES

Br, Jesús Sánchez Martín

Brother Jesús Sánchez Martín, was born 08-05-1936 in Tamames de la Sierra (Salamanca). He made his first profession on 16-07-1952 and the perpetual profession on 15-08-1957 Tui-Spain respectively.

Brother Jesus was staying in the community of Luanda. The last days, he had not been feeling well for that reason he had to be admitted in the hospital where he spent three days and later he was discharged. He came back to the community and since he was not fully recovered, the superiors thought it wise to transfer him to Spain where he could get the best treatment. Unfortunately, Brother Jesus could not resist, he had some complications upon his arrival in Madrid. The Doctors tried their best to reanimate him without success. He passed on Madrid-Spain on 15th June, at the age of 87.



Brother Jesús had worked in Angola for 40 years. He arrived in 1983. He worked in Lobito, Ndalatando and Luanda community, where he spent his last years. In Angola, he had been entrusted to serve as: Community superior, headmaster, teacher, and country bursar. He had been one of the pillars of the Angolan sector, not only for the fact of being the oldest brother but also for his contributions and services to the sector. His commitment to the work, his accountability, his work ethics, his passion to serve the children and youth and his generosity towards the neglected ones made the brothers in Angola to comprehend, that indeed brother Jesus was a role model and a true leader who will always be remembered.

As he was sick, he never wanted to show off about his health state. He always preferred enduring pain alone and this fact was vivid on his last days in the community. There were some days where he could not sleep, and over midnights he used to walk around the community corridors.

As he walked the brothers would listen to his pace and they would wake up to ask him whether he was not feeling fine, however brother Jesus would just say “do not worry I am okay.” And afterwards the following morning he would not mention about his sleepless night, he would just move on with his normal activities. He was also reluctant to go to hospital, one had to be very courageous to persuade him to go to hospital and see a doctor who could examine him.



Brother Jesus passed on and he was cremated in Spain. However, the brothers in Angola also did all what they could to honor him. He passed away on Thursday 15th June, on Friday morning 16th June in the community of Luanda-Angola, the students, teachers and friends, in support, joined the brothers to pray for his soul. The same week Saturday 17th June, the brothers had a mass to commend his soul to God. Then the other week Saturday 24 June 2023, there was seventh week mass to honor his memory. The main celebrant was Auxiliary Bishop of the archdiocese of Luanda, Most Reverend Bishop António Bengue, the co-celebrants were among them reverend Father Adelino Calonda (parish priest of our parish) and distinguished priests who work in our schools and outside. The school and the parish choir animated the liturgy. There were distinguished guests who attended the mass as well, such as religious men and women, teachers, students, former students and teachers, lay Marists, friends, business partners and so on and so forth.

After the eucharistic celebration, there was a cocktail, where people could be served something to eat and drink. It was also a moment to share about some stories that people had experienced with Brother Jesus at some point of their lives and to read out some touching speeches.



Brother Jesus will be remembered in so many ways. The Brothers thanked God for the opportunity he gave them to live with him and they promised to embrace his virtues and qualities especially his sense of belonging, his concern for humanity, his openness to address issues, his spirit of enduring pain, his love for prayer and work, his simplicity and discipline just to mention but a few. The earth has lost a brother but heaven has gained an angel. May Brother Jesus, up there, intercede for all the Marist brothers in Marist mission so that they keep on living the dream of the founder father Champagnat; to make Jesus known and loved specially to the most neglected ones.

May the soul of Brother Jesus through the mercy of God rest in peace!

Br. Mario Colussi was born on 2nd September 1940 in Cape Town. He attended St. Joseph's Marist College in Rondebosch where he met his long-time confrère Br. Jude Pieterse.

He was accepted for the formation programme, which was in Mittagong, NSW, Australia.

In his apostolate as a Christian educator, he worked in the following places:

1963-1976 St. David's Marist College Inanda

1977 St. Joseph's College in Cape Town

1978- 1982 Marist Brother's College, Walmer, PE

1983 Trinity High School, PE

1984- 1988 Zingisa Seminary, Umtata, Transkei

He was a science teacher but in later years, he authored a book on the gospel of Mark.

In the other major services to Marist Institute, he worked as a formator at MIC in Nairobi, Kenya for 6 years up to 1998. He also worked as a Province Secretary from 2010 to 2021.

Mario was a man of the people. He made friends, kept in contact, and enjoy his hikes. Young Brothers will miss him as he was correcting people as they speak.

OBITUARY ADIOS REV. BRO. RAIMUNDO PUENTE CALLEJA 1949 – 2023.




A dark cloud has covered the Marists of Champagnat early this year. With a deep sense of sorrow, the passing on of our beloved one, Rev. Bro. Raimundo Puente Calleja, has been announced by the Provincial of the Marist Province of Compostella in Spain.

Bro. Raimundo or Mundo as he was often called, died on 20th February, 2023 in the community of Valladolid in Spain. He died at the age of 73 and spent 53 years as a Marist brother.

Bro. Mundo was born on 15th November, 1949 in Santa Maria del Campo, (Burgos) Spain. He entered the Juniorate in 1963 and in 1968 the Noviciate after which he made his first vows in 1969. Few years later, he made his final vows at a tender age in 1974, still in Valladolid, Spain.

His first apostolate was in Valladolid at Centro Cultural Vallisoletano. Being young and daring, he later on opted to go on Mission to Africa and so he was sent to St. Paul's Mulungushi Mission in the Central Province of Zambia in 1983, which was ten years after the Spanish Brothers of Castille had taken over the responsibility of the secondary school from the Canadian

Brothers. He came as a teacher of Geography and Religious Education but taught other needy subjects along the years before ascending to the position of Headteacher in 1995. He held this position of responsibility up to 2003 when he handed over to a lay person Mr. Victor Mkumba. Before and during his term as Headteacher, he also held positions of Regional Superior and later on Provincial Councillor of the Marist Province of Southern Africa.



In 2003, the not so young Mundo was given a daunting responsibility of starting a new Marist Mission in Chibuluma compound of Kalulushi in Copperbelt Province. He, Bro. Felipe, Bro. Mansoa and Bro. Evans, worked hard to construct Marist Education Centre from an ordinary bush area. This consists of a Secondary School and a Skills Training Centre for which Mundo became its first Director in 2011 when it was opened.

Bro. Mundo left Kalulushi and Zambia in 2016 due to ill health after surviving a minor stroke that year. He had since recovered and was up and about in Spain till the last two years when his health started failing him.

Bro. Mundo, will be remembered for his honesty, integrity, hard work, resourcefulness, concern for the youth and love for Marist life. He ran a good race and has left behind a strong foundation at the Marist Education Centre. Go well RAIMUNDO and rest in peace. We shall miss you but sweet memories of the good times shared with you will console us knowing it is well with your soul. The funeral ceremony will take place on 22nd February, 2023 from 10.00hrs to 12.00hrs at the Champagnat residence in Valladolid, Spain. Mass is scheduled to start at 12.00hrs and thereafter cremation will follow. We pray for the soul of Bro. Raimundo and thank the resurrected Christ for his life devoted to others. ADIOS MUNDO! REST IN PEACE.

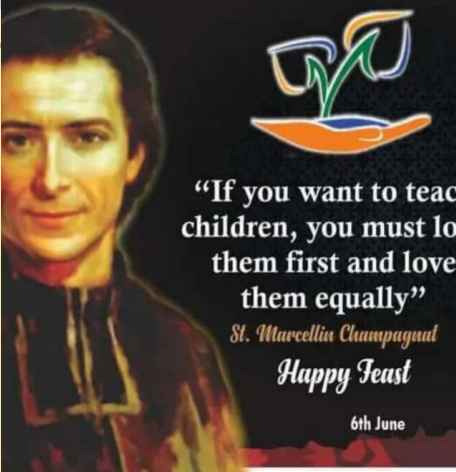
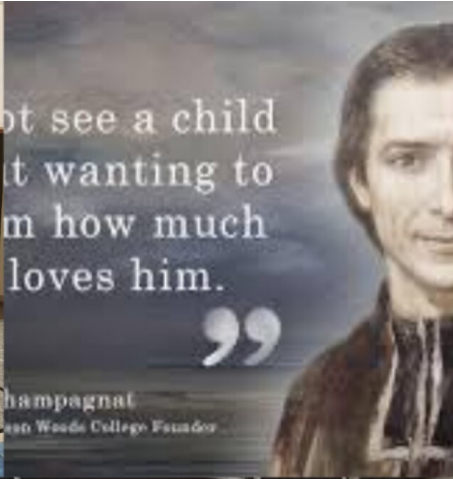
