CRUZ DEL SUR CONCLUDED THE SYNODAL ASSEMBLY



he <u>Cruz del Sur province</u> concluded on August 5 the <u>ReConocerNos</u> Assembly, a Synod Time that seeks to promote dialogue, listening and discernment among the Marists of the province. The assembly was held from August 3 to 5 at Villa Marista San José, in Luján, Argentina, one year after its launch in 2022.

More than 180 members of the Marist Community from different parts of the Cruz del Sur Province participated: 26 Brothers, 5 Lay Communities, 62 Leadership Teams, 10 students, 15 young Marists, 42 members of the Provincial Animation and 21 Frequent Participants.

During the synodal assembly, the Marists unanimously lived the charism of Champagnat that brought them together. They were three intense days, whose vibration will continue to accompany them until the pending phase of analysis is concluded, and the voting on the lines of action that the Assembly will envisage and will guide the path for the next few years.

In a fraternal atmosphere and active exchange of ideas, the Marist meeting fostered among its members a singular experience as a vital community, a community of communities in the Church. A time of joyful presence, of dialogues and different perspectives. Also, a time of longing, repairing gestures, hope and committed and inclusive participation.

The process began in 2022, with a time of broad and profound listening, animated by the Spirit in all areas of the province.

PATRONAL FEAST OF THE INSTITUTE

he Church celebrates the feast of the Assumption of Mary on 15 August. This day is also the patronal feast of the Institute. For Marcellin Champagnat, Mary, the Good Mother, was his constant inspiration. And he wanted his holy ministry to begin on the feast of the Assumption.

In the book Life of Father Champagnat. we read that Marcellin Champagnat "faithful to his resolution of always going to Jesus through Mary, on leaving the seminary after ordination, he made his way to Fourvières in order to consecrate his ministry to the Blessed Virgin; and each time that business took him to Lyon, he visited the shrine of Fourvières to renew that offering and that consecration, at Mary's feet.

When he was appointed curate of La Valla, he went there on a Saturday and wanted his holy ministry

to begin on the feast of the Assumption so that Mary might bless its first fruits and herself present them to her divine Son. That is the way he acted all his life, offering and entrusting to Mary all his plans and works, and he would begin them only after prolonged prayer for her blessing. Every day, during his visits to the Blessed Sacrament he would go and pay homage to the Blessed Virgin. Yet that wasn't enough to satisfy his piety. In his own room, he erected a small altar on which he placed her statue. There, at all hours of the day, he sent up fervent prayers to her, and often remained long hours prostrate at her feet." The Constitutions of the Institute recommend who "We celebrate Marial feast days in the spirit of the liturgy, in particular the Assumption, the patronal feast of the Institute" (50.3). In his Spiritual Testament, Saint Marcellin recommends "that a tender and filial love for our Good Mother never fail you in all the changes of time and circumstance. Proclaim her love in every place, as far as lies in your power. She is the first Supe-

Particularly in Brazil, this day has great importance for Marist Life and Mission, as it is celebrated as "Day of the Marist".



GENERAL HOUSE

RESTORATION OF THE STAINED-GLASS WINDOWS OF THE MAIN CHAPEL

he Main Chapel of the General House is well known in the Marist world, since with its dome and cross on top, it is an important monument that recalls the Marist mission, focused on making known Christ's love for humanity. The General House complex was inaugurated in 1961, the same year



that the artist Giovanni D'Aloisio, who died in 2016, made the stained-glass windows of the dome, and the cross on the door at the entrance of the chapel, made of bronze.

The stained-glass windows of the dome, with Marian symbols on an abstract background, favour the colour blue and evoke the invocations of the Lauretan Litanies. After 60 years of its installation, the stained-glass windows showed evidence of significant deterioration. The glasses were bent on the inside, and the oxidized lead, used as a moulding, did not guarantee safety, and caused some fragments of the material to fall. In addition, the stained-glass windows had no external protection, and they

were exposed to weather conditions that caused the accumulation of dirt, both outside and inside.

The General Administration contacted Samuele Pulcini, the Italian artist living in Saint Etienne, France, to assess the situation and carry out the restoration. The work was carried out in 4 phases for each group of stained-glass windows: panel reconstruction; cleaning of the fragments and replacement

of damaged glasses; assembly of glasses in new lead frames; and placement of the new structure, installation of protective glasses and restored stained glass windows.

Samuele Pulcini is originally from Albano Laziale and trained in the art studio of Domus DEI Rome". He learned from different masters the art of fire-painted stained glass, the "Dallas glass" technique, working with fiberglass and the realization of mosaics. In 2012, together with his wife and six children, he was sent by Pope Benedict XVI to a mission in the diocese of Saint Etienne, in France, where he currently lives and works in his own workshop, carrying out new works and restoring everything. the world.

THE MARIST BROTHERS' PROJECT IN WEST BENGAL

Improving the education of Santali girls and boys through study centers and promoting gender equality



he state of West Bengal, India, is renowned for its rich cultural heritage and diverse communities. However, the region faces numerous socio-economic challenges, particularly among marginalized communities like the Santal minority. Historically reliant on hunting for sustenance, the Santals have been compelled to turn to agriculture due to the ever-increasing population and dwindling resources. As agricultural labourers, they earn less than \$3 a day, leaving them vulnerable to social exclusion and poverty. Unemployment among the Santal youth has been rising, leading to an alarming rise in drug and alcohol addiction. Moreover, access to quality education remains a significant concern for the Santals, as illiteracy rates are high, especially among women and those living in remote and economically vulnerable villages.

Recognizing these struggles, the Marist Brothers of India are embarking on a mission to address these challenges by launching these itinerant classes project. This visionary project seeks to promote human development through education, with a specific focus on empowering students with fundamental skills in reading, writing, English, Mathematics, and Bengali classes. Additionally, the project strives to equip the youth with essential skills that will enable them to pursue self-employment opportunities or secure positions in both private and government sectors.

Educational opportunities to remote areas

The main goal of the Marist Brothers' Project is to extend educational opportunities to remote areas where access to formal institutions is limited or non-existent. By providing itinerant classes in these communities, the project ensures that the benefits of education reach every corner of the region. Furthermore, the project is committed to eradicating all forms of discrimination based on caste, tribe, gender, or

social status. Emphasizing inclusivity, the Marist Brothers strive to uplift communities in vulnerable conditions and foster a sense of unity and acceptance among the students. the charism and the strengthening of the institutional identity, bringing together books, publications, Marist songs, letters of

BONDING OF LAYPEOPLE TO THE MARIST CHARISM IN THE FRATERNITIES OF THE CMMF IN BRASIL SUL-AMAZÔNIA

he lay men and women of the Marist Province of Brasil Sul-Amazônia are experiencing a very important moment in their vocational journey. Since the beginning of this year, the members of the Champagnat Movement of the Marist Family (CMMF) have been carrying out the Bonding to the Marist charism.

According to the guidelines of the Movement, the desire to be linked to the Marist charism is a personal process of accompanied discernment, which does not mean that the person has a link with the Marist institution. "It is a free and joyful expression. It fosters and strengthens the sense of family and community. The link is to the charism and does not mean legal belonging" (Guidelines of the CMMF, Annex 5). During the first semester of 2023, three Fraternities of the State of Rio Grande do Sul have already made the Marist charismatic attachment. They are: Santa Cruz Fraternity (Santa Cruz do

Sul), Brother Rovílio Fraternity (Santa Maria) and Family of Mary Fraternity (Porto Alegre). For Adelmo Etges, of the Fraternity Family of Mary, among the reasons that led him to bonding to the Marist charism is the desire to live the Marist values in their fullness, having Mary, the Good Mother, and Saint Marcellin Champagnat as models and inspiration. "Among the feelings that have sprung from



this moment are belonging, witness and the joy of participating in a great family that shares values and principles based on the Christian faith and the Church", he evaluates.

Likewise, Everson Belous, of the Fraternity of Brother



Rovilio, recalls that his Marist journey, which began in childhood, brought him closer to the Marist charism which is an inexhaustible source of motivation and inspiration. "As I connected with the charism, I felt a strong connection with shared values and principles. The feeling of belonging to something greater and the commitment to spread these teachings by acting on them in my daily life has strengthened immensely. This feeling is like a flame that warms the heart and drives the search to be more human every day", he explains.

During the next semester, other Fraternities and Lay Marists will also carry out Bonding to the Marist charism.

In Brazil there are 64 fraternities of the Champagnat Movement: 33 in the Province of Brasil Sul-Amazônia, 23 in the Province of Brasil Centro-Norte and 28 in the Province of Brasil Centro-Sul.

MEETING OF THE PREPARATORY COMMISSION OF MIMA III


