#### Dear Brothers

I remember two Hebrew words from my scripture studies. They are significant because of the frequency with which they are used in the scriptures, and secondly because they express what salvation history reveals about the very character of the Divine. They are 'hesed' and 'emet'.

The Hebrew word *hesed* (sometimes *chesed*) is translated into English as either steadfast love, loving-kindness, mercy, love, or unfailing love, depending on the particular translation of the Bible. It's used 248 times in the Old Testament, with fifty percent of its usage in the Psalms.

In Hebrew though, hesed is such a rich and robust term that no single English word captures its essence. Hesed is not just mercy, but covenant loyalty and relational fidelity. It is freely given, often unexpectedly, without requiring anything in return. Even though hesed stems from covenant (contract) loyalty, there is a sense that the loyalty surpasses the letter of the law. In Hosea, God said that he desires mercy (hesed), not sacrifice (law), which Jesus reiterated in Matthew 9:13. Jesus further reinforced this thought when speaking about the Roman law forcing locals to carry soldiers' packs for a mile; Jesus suggested going an extra mile (Matthew 5:41). So hesed describes the rich and robust depth of God's character.

The second word, 'emet' can be translated into English as faithfulness or verity (truth). It carries an underlying sense of certainty and dependability. Emet is often coupled with hesed, creating a synergism of two of God's strongest attributes. We know that when synergy occurs the combined effect is greater than the sum of the individual attributes. So hesed and emet provide a most powerful glimpse of who God is: love and

faithfulness, mercy and truth. In plain English – we can be certain of and depend on God's steadfast love.

And since we know that Jesus is the visible expression of the invisible God (Colossians 1:15), the God of *hesed* and *emet*, we see these characteristics reflected in Jesus' life and mission. Moreover, as Christians who are called to follow Jesus, we know that these characteristics must feature in our lives as well.

I raise these words today in the context of our Jubilee celebrations.

Last weekend, I attended the New Zealand Jubilees. We were especially honouring seven Brothers: **Kevin King** and **Brian Callaghan** (50 Years), **Bill Lawley** and **Des Quirke** (60 Years), **Fergus Garrett, Alan Henley** and **Humphrey O'Connor** (70 years). We commenced on Saturday night with a Mass and renewal of Vows at Sacred Heart College, followed by a gathering at Villa Maria community. On Sunday, we celebrated at Onehunga with prayer, presentation of plaques and candles, festive lunch, toasts and speeches. One of the aspects I most liked was that each Jubilarian was invited to offer a suitable quote and a prayer that reflected his feelings and experiences. You will see these words later in this Star Messenger.

When we celebrate Jubilees we aren't just remembering the passing years – Birthdays do that. We're not just recalling the fact that some men have

lived longer than others – though there is that element. What we are commemorating is the divine characteristic that these men have expressed in their long years of fidelity to their vocation. Their faithfulness brings us into contact with the dependability and loving



kindness (the *hesed* and *emet*) of God. These celebrations bring to clarity our Jubilarians' continuing desire and commitment to bring Jesus to others: to make Him known and loved.

I congratulate and thank Kevin, Brian, Bill, Des, Fergus, Alan and Humphrey for all they have been to us, their brothers, and for all they have done to serve others with such dependable faithfulness.


