China Sector Annual Assembly and Celebration of the 60th Anniversary of Br. Joachim Heng as Marist Brother

The Marist Brothers of the China Sector had their Annual Sector Assembly from September 1 to 3. It was held at the Parish Hall of Holy Name of Mary Catholic Church in Permatang Tinggi, Simpang Ampat, Penang, Malaysia.

The first day was intended as an arrival day since the brothers came from different countries, namely Singapore, West and East Malaysia, and the Philippines. It was participated by 11 brothers who were housed at Homestay Ang Garden in Bukit Mertajam, Pulau Penang, Malaysia.

During the morning of the second day, September 2, the brothers, through the help of the former Marist Juniors of Penang, went on a pilgrimage to Minor Basilica of St. Anne and visited SRJK (C) Kim Sen, the school that used to be administered by the brothers in Bukit Mertajam. In the afternoon, the Parish Priest of the Holy Name of Mary Catholic Church generously allowed the brothers to use their Parish Hall for their Assembly. Br. Anthony Tay, the Sector Coordinator, together with Br. Allan J. de Castro, the Provincial, led the brothers into a meaningful reflection of their life and mission in the province in the midst of their present realities, namely the aging brothers, the lack of vocation, the presence in school and other ministries and many others.

On September 3, the Sector celebrated the Jubilee of Br. Joachim Heng, FMS - 60th Year Anniversary of being a Marist Brother. It was attended by the Brothers, Lay Marists, and his own family, relatives, friends, and benefactors. During the reception, he thanked all those who journeyed with him during the last 60 years. Indeed, it was a day full of gratitude for the brothers in the China Sector.

Khim and Liz's story is a reminder that each of us holds the power to make a difference. As Picasso once said, "The meaning of life is to find your gift. The purpose of



Greetings from the "Nerve Center" of the Province!

Since I arrived from Marikina, I have been continuously adjusting to the new environment, one that I experienced as more relaxing but, at the same time, demanding. It is relaxing in so far as the quiet, less polluted environment is concerned. It is away from the hustle and bustle of the Metro Dadiangas and only a minute's walk from the parish church. It is demanding because of the variety of office work, totally unlike the business office of a school I was accustomed to, where I have more specific helpers to do the job. Here in the Province business office, I don't have the luxury of experts' advice. I have to switch from one type of job to another depending on my capacity to think and the demands of the time. Nonetheless, I am challenged to cope with the situation, most especially after Romy left for his New Zealand course. This difficult job is very much lightened, however, by the presence of Bebs Bacalando, whose expertise is very much in demand. She is the source of answers to all the problems I have encountered in the past, and will continue to depend on her in the future. So far, the situation is very much under control.

The Province House community includes five Brothers, two houseboys, a cook, and a lavandera. included in our extended family are the two regular office employees and the two student aides. The Brothers are Ted, the Provincial, as well as the House Superior. Romy, his secretary, and George, the recruiter who is constantly on the go. Pop, the retired member of the community, and Gilbert, the newcomer. All are nonearners but are good spenders. Most often, Gilbert is the only one left to hold the fort, which he doesn't mind at all. Pops and George often just come in and go without notice. Pops, when he wants to renew his community life or that of his family, and George, when he needs replenishment of his purse. Since they do not have jobs in the office, they follow their own specific schedules and hidden agenda. Working in the "Nerve Center" of the Province gave me a wider horizon and perspective. News from around the Marist World, both good and bad, filters through the office. Thanks to the hi-tech communication in the form of e-mails and faxes, I can easily learn what is going on in any part of the planet. Ted and Romy had been using these modern modes of communication. Often, in his many stopovers in various places he visited, Ted had sent messages either by e-mail or fax for his news and updates to the office. Romy is doing the same thing now while following his course in Wellington, New Zealand. Ted phoned the news about the death of the younger sister of the late Bro—Leonard from Toronto, Canada. The whole proceedings of the Conference of Provincials in Rome, including their sightseeing trips, were relayed to the office via e-mails. And Romy's request from Wellington, New Zealand, for articles he needs for the course came also by fax. These sighted incidents prove the versatility of these wonderful inventions. Besides, they are faster and cheaper than regular telephone calls! As per the schedules of Brothers Ted Fernandez and Romy Porras, the former will be arriving here on the 14 of November, while the latter, on the 25th of the same month. Ted intends to pass by Korea before touching down at GenSan airport. Romy and Wency may visit Adelaide to see Columbanus. Meanwhile, Gilbert will continue to run the office as much as possible, doing the necessary work for the Province. Brother John Tan, the Province Econome, will be happy to entertain all financial questions. Please direct your communication to his office at NDKC, Kidapawan, Cotabato.
