



### **Month of Mary**

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. The month of October is dedicated to the holy Rosary as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary falls on October 7th. The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary.

The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centered on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption with each decade referring to an event in the life of Jesus and Mary. The Mysteries of the Rosary give us "thumbnails" of the life of Christ and his Mother.

- The Joyful Mysteries are taken mostly from Saint Luke's Gospel in the New Testament. They involve the joyful events of Jesus' childhood.
- The Luminous Mysteries bring a deeper understanding to the public life of Jesus. They fill in the blanks between the childhood of Jesus and His suffering and death on the cross.
- The Sorrowful Mysteries remind us of how much Jesus loves us. They recall how He suffered and died just for us.

The Glorious Mysteries tell us what happened after Jesus died-His Resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the love Jesus had for his Mother.

viving society.





## Pre Marist World Youth Day - Carcavelos/Lisbon - Portugual

With over 230 young Marists from different corners of the Marist World, four members of the Southern African Province, were present in the event, and they were Nyasha from South Africa, Janiva, Adilson e Bro Euclides from Angola, the bigger African representation so far.

Then the "Into the Deep" kicked off and it was a success, firstly for providing the experience of being able to be in touch with the four General Superiors of the Marist Family: Marist Fathers, Marist Sisters, Marist Missionary Sisters and the Marist Brothers. And also for bringing together young people from different countries and cultures as well as languages in a single space in order to discuss the influence of the Marist Family in the World and in the Church. This experience was very positive for us, due to the sharing that not even a plurality of cultures and languages could stop, the possibility of seeing the four Marist branches living side by side as one. The group sharing catechesis as well as the themes that were the subject of reflection during the meeting, made any barriers to be broken. Another important element was the possibility of realizing how good it is to live connected, to live in the presence of God, because the moments were good experiences of connection (with God, others and to our own hearts). The connection mentioned above must be one that brings us fundamentally closer to God and that then allows us to travel into the depths of our being as creatures of God.

#### **World Youth Day**

It was a great pilgrimage, and this one, Southern Africa was represented by six members, adding three from Mozambique: Bro António and two students: Denalda and Molungo, Nyasha had already left. We took part from the open mass with the Patriarch of Lisbon, the reception of the Holy Father to the mass of send off. Everything was so intense that the tiredness only became evident when the event was finished. The journey for us had it is main point, the meeting with the Holy Father. The catechesis were very useful, where we discussed topics such as Global Ecology and the importance of taking into account the preservation of the world so that we can live and fight for the same cause. The possibility of hearing and seeing the Holy Father live gave us a feeling of great satisfaction. The sermons were special to hear and apply, as there was a lot of caution and intelligence in what was said and in the way it was said. To paraphrase the Holy Father: the Church is open for everyone, God loves us as we are and not as we would like us to be; this passage made us reflect on the question previously asked about the way we look at the LGBT in the church, which in my opinion was answered with great intelligence and wisdom.

Therefore, we would like to thank the Marist Brothers from Southern African and from Compostela Province for giving us this great opportunity. We are indeed grateful.

#### Portugal - Carcavelos/Lisboa

A Jornada Mundial Marista decorreu em Portugal, concretamente em Carcavelos tendo contado com pouco mais de 230 jovens Maristas provenientes das mais diversas partes do Mundo e pertencentes aos quatro ramos da Família Marista, entre os quais uma boa representação da Província da África Austral, Janiva, Adilson e Irmão Euclides. A mesma foi subordinada ao Lema: "Into the Deep" que traduzido para o português fica "Nas Profundezas".

A Pré-jornada foi um sucesso, primeiramente por proporcionar a experiência de poder conviver com os Superiores Gerais de cada um dos Ramos Maristas, por congregar jovens de diferentes países e com culturas bem como idiomas diferentes num único espaço a fim de abordar sobre a influência da Família Marista no Mundo.

O lema acima mencionado levou-nos a reflectir sobre a Influência da Vida e Obra de Jesus Cristo nas nossas vidas, pois que à luz do mesmo a única forma de ouvir Deus é indo às Profundezas do nosso ser, onde o silêncio é ensurdecedor e a Paz reina.

A experiência foi bastante positiva para nós, pelas partilhas que nem pluralidade de culturas e idiomas conseguiram barrar, pela possibilidade de ver os quatro ramos Maristas convivendo lado a lado como um só, pelas catequeses de partilha em grupo bem como pelos temas que foram objecto reflexão durante o encontro, fazendo com que as barreiras fossem quebradas. ### BROTHER ALPHONSE TIAMARO APPOINTED PROVINCIAL OF MADAGASCAR

Br. Ernesto Sánchez, Superior General, and his Council, after studying the consultation of the brothers of the province have appointed Br. Alphonse Tiamaro as the Provincial of Madagascar for a period of three years. Br. Alphonse will begin his mandate during the celebration of the next Provincial Chapter which will take place from the 5th to the 7th of January 2024.

Br. Ernesto Sánchez, Superior General, thanked Br. Michel Maminiaina Razafimandimby for his commitment during these six years of leadership in the province, and he also thanked him for his participation and support to the Africa region and the Institute. In a letter sent to the province on 29 September, Br. Ernesto greeted and thanked the Provincial Council and all those who collaborate in the different provincial animation teams, both brothers and lay people.

### **Brother Alphonse Tiamaro**

Brother Alphonse was born on May 15, 1978, in Mananjary, Madagascar. He has one sister and five brothers, and he is the second to last in the family. In 1995, after having obtained his baccalaureate (secondary school certificate) he entered the postulate of the Marist Brothers in Fianarantsoa, for his 2-year initial formation. In October 1997 he began his novitiate, and on June 6, 1999, he made his first vows. After the novitiate, he did a four-year scholasticate in Nairobi, known as MIC (Marist International Centre) in Kenya.

In 2003 he returned to Madagascar, and, after a 3-year experience of community life, he pronounced his final vows on December 17, 2006. From 2006 to 2009 he completed a formation of formators course, and he pursued his higher education studies in Nairobi. After his studies, the head of the province appointed him responsible for the postulancy of Ampahidrano Fianarantsoa. Later, in 2012, he left Madagascar to go to Rwanda, and work in the novitiate as a formator, a position he held for 4 years. Then, in September 2016, the brother responsible for the province asked him to reinforce the formation team for young scholastics in Nairobi.


In Nairobi, he developed different activities as an animator and guide for young brothers, and a professor at the Marist University of Nairobi (MIUC), among other responsibilities.

Since 2019, he has been a member of the International Commission of Brothers Today, representing young people and formators of the MIC.

At the same time, he serves in the CSAC (Conference of Superiors of the African Continent) as a member of the regional commissions. This year, 2023, he has completed seven years as a formator in the MIC, and the brother responsible for the province of Madagascar has once again appointed him responsible for the postulate of Ampahidrano.

MARCELLIN CHAMPAGNAT was born on 20th May 1789, in Marlhes, a village in the mountains of east-central France. The Revolution was about to burst upon the scene. He was the ninth child of a very Christian family, from whom he received his basic education. His mother and his aunt, a religious driven from her convent, awoke in him a solid faith and deep devotion to Mary. His father, who was a farmer and merchant, possessed an above-average education, and played a significant role in the politics of the village and the region. He imparted to Marcellin his aptitude for manual work, a penchant for direct action, a sense of responsibility, and openness to new ideas.

When Marcellin was 14, a priest passing through the village helped him to see that God was calling him to the priesthood. Marcellin, whose formal schooling was practically non-existent, began to study because "God wills it!", even while those around him, aware of his limitations, tried to dissuade him. The difficult years he spent in the minor seminary in Verrieres (1805-1813) were for him a time of real human and spiritual growth.

Among his companions in the major seminary in Lyons were Jean-Marie Vianney, the future Cure of Ars, and Jean-Claude Colin who was to become the founder of the Marist Fathers. He joined a group of seminarians whose goal was to found a congregation bearing Mary's name and including priests, sisters and a lay third order the "Society of Mary" for the re-Christianisation of society. Deeply aware of the cultural and spiritual poverty of the children of the countryside, Marcellin felt a strong urge to include a branch of brothers for the Christian education of young people. "I cannot see a child without wanting to tell him how much Jesus loves him." The day after their ordination on 22nd July 1816, these young priests went to consecrate themselves to Mary and to place their project under her protection at the shrine of Our Lady of Fourviere.



Marcellin was sent as curate to the parish of La Valla. His ministry there included visiting the sick, catechizing the children, helping the poor, and helping families to live the Christian life. His simple, direct style of preaching, his deep devotion to Mary, and his apostolic zeal, made a profound impression on his parishioners. His encounter with a dying 17-year-old boy who had absolutely no religious instruction, shook him to his depths, and moved him not to delay any longer in putting his plans into action.

On 2nd January 1817, only six months after his arrival in La Valla, Marcellin, a 27-year-old curate, brought together his first two disciples; the congregation of the Little Brothers of Mary, or Marist Brothers, was born in poverty, humility, and total trust in God under Mary's protection. While still carrying on his parish ministry, he went to live with his brothers, whom he trained and prepared for their mission as Christian teachers, catechists, and educators of young people. Passionately devoted to the Kingdom of God, conscious of the tremendous needs of young people, and an instinctive educator, Marcellin turned these uncultured young country lads into generous apostles. He lost no time in opening schools. Vocations arrived and the first little house, even though enlarged by Marcellin himself, was soon too small. There were many difficulties. The clergy in general did not understand what this inexperienced young priest with no material resources was trying to accomplish. However, the nearby villages continually requested brothers to see to the Christian education of their children.

Marcellin and his brothers shared in the construction of their new house, which could hold more than 100 persons and which would bear the name of "Our Lady of the Hermitage". Freed from his parish duties in 1825, he thenceforth devoted himself totally to his congregation: the spiritual, pedagogical and apostolic formation and accompaniment of his brothers, visits to the schools, and the opening of new ones.

Marcellin, a man of deep faith, never ceased to seek the will of God through prayer and dialogue with the religious authorities and with his brothers. Very conscious of his own limitations, he counted only on God and on the protection of Mary, his "Good Mother", "Ordinary Resource" and "First Superior". His deep humility, and his acute awareness of the presence of God, helped him to live through many severe trials with great inner peace. He often prayed psalm 126: "If the Lord does not build the house", convinced that this congregation of brothers was the work of God and Mary. His motto was, "All to Jesus through Mary, and all to Mary for Jesus".

"To make Jesus Christ known and loved" is the brothers' mission. The school is the privileged setting for this mission of evangelisation. Marcellin taught his disciples to love and respect children, and to give special attention to the poor, the most ungrateful and the most neglected, especially orphans. Spending a great deal of time with young people, with simplicity, family spirit and love of work, and all of this carried out as Mary would have, were the essential points of his vision of education.

In 1836, the Church recognized the Society of Mary and entrusted to it the missions of Oceania. Marcellin took his vows as a member of the Society of Mary, and sent three brothers with the first missionary Marist Fathers to the islands of the Pacific. "Every diocese of the world figures in our plans", he had written.

Steps for obtaining legal recognition of his congregation made great demands on his time, energy and spirit of faith. He never stopped repeating, "When God is on your side, and you rely only on him, nothing is impossible!"

A lengthy illness gradually wore down his robust constitution. Worn out by his labors, he died at the age of 51 on 6th June 1840, leaving this message with his brothers: "May you be of one heart and one mind. May it be said of the Little Brothers of Mary as of the first Christians: see how they love one another!"

Extract of the speech of the Provincial Superior Br. Emmanuel on the occasion of the perpetual profession of Br. Ângelo Cassinda in Angola on 9th September 2023

Bro. Ângelo, the step that you have taken today is clear confirmation of your original commitment made some few years ago, you have given it definitive character. This commitment is not for yourself alone, but for the benefit of the Congregation and ultimately for the benefit of the Universal Church. (A solemn profession is a holocaust, a total gift of oneself to God, and the most perfect imitation of Christ).




On the day of the purification in the Temple, Jesus offered himself to his Father without reserve; and from the time of this official oblation, so to speak, every moment of his life he

did what 'pleased the Father' until on the Cross, he pronounced his Consummatum Est... You have made a firm resolution to imitate this perfect oblation of Jesus by transforming yourself into a holocaust of faith, hope and charity.' It is indeed God's project that Angelo has committed himself to for the rest of his life."

# FORMATION PROGRAM ON SERVANT AND PROPHETIC LEADERSHIP



The face-to-face phase of the second edition of the Formation Program on Servant and Prophetic Leadership takes place in Philippines, from 23 October till 3 November. The course, aimed at the English and French speaking public, is promoted by the General Administration of the Institute, in collaboration with Notre Dame of Marbel University.

The <u>course was launched on May 30<sup>th</sup></u>. The participants had a first phase online, till October 07, 2023. In Philippines, there are 30 participants, who came from 19 countries from America, Asia, and Africa, representing 9 Administrative Units. From the General Administration are present Brothers Luis Carlos Gutiérrez, Vicar General, Ben Consigli, General Councilor, and Goyo Linacero, Project Manager of the Strategic Plan of the General Administration.

The course is intended for leaders of Marist Administrative Units who work in the strategic areas of mission development. The objective of this formation program is to prepare Marist leaders, from the perspective of the Servant and Prophetic Leadership, for a conscious mission (education, evangelization, children's rights, governance, and management with empowerment), adapted to the current contemporary trends and emerging needs.

This program is an initiative of the General Administration in response to the call of the  $22^{nd}$  General Chapter to develop servant and prophetic leadership accompanying Marist life and mission.

Some expectations of the face-to-face phase are sharing of knowledge, life experiences, and perspectives of Marist life and mission in your context.

<u>The first edition</u>, with 61 participants from 19 countries, was held in 2022, in collaboration with the PUC of Porto Alegre, Brazil, for Portuguese and Spanish speaking Marists.
