INTRODUCTION

• Brief and spontaneous introduction by the animator, giving emphasis to the significance of this day, that is, the 25th anniversary of the canonization of St. Marcellin Champagnat.

READING OF THE "DECLARATION OF MARCELLIN CHAMPAGNAT AS SAINT"

Decretal letter with which the honors of the saints are conferred to blessed joseph benedict marcellin champagnat by john paul pp. ii servant of the servants of god, to perpetual memory

The cause of canonization began in Lyon with the Ordinary Process on August 2, 1888. Having fulfilled the provisions of the juridical norms of the time, our predecessor Pius XII, on 29 May 1955, proclaimed him Blessed.

In view of the canonization, on July 3, 1998, in our presence, the decree super miraculo was promulgated, which took place in Montevideo in 1976. Encouraged by the favorable vote of the Cardinals and Bishops gathered in consistory, we decided that the rite of canonization would be held in Rome on 18 April 1999.

That is why today in St. Peter's Square, during the sacred celebrations, we pronounced this formula of canonization:

To the honor of the Most Holy Trinity, for the exaltation of the Catholic faith and the increase of the Christian life, with the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul and of Ours, after much reflection, invoking divine help several times and listening to the opinion of many of our Brothers in the episcopate, we declare and define as Saints the Blessed Marcellinus Joseph Benedict Champagnat, [Giovanni Calabria and Agostina Livia Pietrantoni] and we inscribe them in the Roll of Saints and establish that throughout the Church they are devoutly honored among the Saints.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Spirit.

Moreover, what we have decreed we want to take effect now and, in the future, in spite of everything to the contrary.

Given in Rome at St. Peter's on April 18 of the year of our Lord 1999, the twentieth first of our Pontificate. John Paul II Bishop of the Catholic Church

PRAYER TO MARCELLIN

(Based on the homily of Pope John Paul II on the day of the canonization)

St. Marcellin, you also invite us to be missionaries, to make Jesus Christ known and loved, with Mary as our guide and Mother. Pray that the Lord will give us a heart that burns like yours, to recognize Him and to be His witnesses.

In the midst of a turbulent world and despite difficulties, may we have an unshakeable faith to remain faithful to Christ. May we discover the seeds of the Kingdom and put our energies in bringing them to fruition. Amen.

(Based on his Biography by Br. Jean Baptist Fure, this litany was first used in during the closure of the Year of Marist Vocations, 6th June 2023)

- St. Marcellin, you gave your time and energy to form the brothers to virtue and keep them faithful and joyful in their vocation. Teach us to care for and generate Marist life. St. Marcellin, you worked relentlessly to help the brothers in their human and spiritual development, perfecting their characters, inspiring them to love prayer, savor it and to always put Christ at the center. - St. Marcellin, like the Good Shepherd, you constantly led you flock and with great care. You left the rectory to live with the brothers and take part in their daily life. You worked with them, whether in the garden or making nails, and joined them in recreation.
