

ABOUT TIMOR- LESTE

THE MARISTS IN TIMOR-LESTE



Following the 1999 independence referendum in Timor-Leste, Brothers from the Melbourne Province arrived in 2000 at the request of Bishop Dom Basilio do Nascimento of the Diocese of Baucau to commence a teacher training college under the leadership of Br Mark Paul, FMS. Since that time, with successive Brother directors, the College, officially Instituto Católico Para Formação de Professores (ICFP), has developed and grown in stature and reputation. The ICFP is regarded as one of the top performing tertiary Institutions in the country, under the Governance of Bishop Dom Leandro Maria Alves, Bishop of Baucau.

Currently Br Peter Corr, FMS, is the President and Br Paul Gilchrist, FMS, is the Director. Over the past 24 years, Marist connections with Timor-Leste have grown and deepened. Australian Marist Solidarity (AMS) has provided funding for a range of projects, including reconstruction of schools, post-school skilling, social support, and inclusion opportunities.

The Marist Brothers, through its local agency Fundação Marista Timor-Leste, or FMTL, are currently building the first Marist school in Lautem in the Baucau Diocese.

Baucau Community





Presently, the Marist Brothers community in Baucau comprises four residences. These are

- Teulale residence Postulancy (3 Brothers and 8 postulants)
- Wainiki Scholasticate residence (7 Brothers)
- Kai Laki Scholasticate residence (6 Brothers)

Tirilolo Residence (ICFP - 3 Brothers)

A Community Council comprising the Community Leader, Assistant Community Leader, Ministry Leader, Bursar and three Timorese Brothers meet regularly to discuss and implement the Community life plan and organise events and gatherings.



Bishop Leandro Maria Alves, the newly appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Baucau recently visited ICFP and met with Brothers, staff and students, in his role as Governor of the College. Br Paul Gilchrist, FMS, Director of ICFP showed Bishop Leandro around the facilities. We look forward to deepening our relationship with Bishop Leandro and the Diocese of Baucau as we continue our commitment to providing excellent graduate Catholic teachers for Timor-Leste.

PJM (Pastoral Juventude Marista) is a faith and action group operating out of ICFP and comprises students, student Brothers and professors. Similar to Marists Youth Ministry and Young Marists in Australia, PJM was begun by Brothers and Lay Marists from the Brazilian Provinces, who have appointed several of their members to work in Timor-Leste over the past many years.

It was a truly international affair with Brothers and novices from Sri Lanka, Brazil, Australia, Spain, French Canada, Cambodia, Timor Leste, Vietnam, Papua New Guinea, and Bangladesh in attendance.

Marist School in Lautem inches towards completion!

Our first Marist school, located in the District of Lautem in the eastern end of Timor-Leste, is past the halfway point of construction. Commencing in 2025, Marist College Lautem will cater to primary students from local and remote families in the mountains and gradually build up to a full primary and secondary college. A community of Brothers and teachers will reside there. Unfortunately, the pandemic has significantly hampered the work on the project with a shortage of materials and skilled workers in the country.

Triloka Development continues

Marist Postulancy Program





Casa Marista Teulale is the formation house for the SOTS Postulancy program. Currently, there are eight Timorese postulants, with a further two postulants from Pasifika anticipated in August.

Stage 1 of the Postulancy focuses on intensive English learning with formation, apostolic ministry, and accompaniment. Stage 2 provides more in-depth study in prayer, vocational discernment, and spiritual and human formation.

The Postulancy formation team comprises Br Matthew Green, FMS, (coordinator) and Br Paul Kane, FMS (formator).

ICFP receives an excellent Report Card



Every five years, tertiary institutes in Timor-Leste are evaluated by a national accreditation agency, ANAAA (Agência Nacional Para A Avaliação Académica).

ICFP was due for an evaluation in 2021, but the COVID pandemic put things on hold and the appraisal was delayed by two years. The Institute was formally inspected through the period July-October 2023.

The inspecting panel included a Professor from Indonesia, a local academic from another Institute and two representatives from ANAAA. The process was extremely thorough and looked at ten different aspects of the Institute's program, including governance and leadership, actual curriculum and learning experiences for the students, human resources, finance structures, community engagement and stakeholder feedback.



Due to a backlog of work caused by the pandemic, ANAAA arranged for eight tertiary institutes to be inspected during 2023, led by international panellists from Indonesia and Malaysia. On 9 February 2024, the Directors of the eight institutes were summoned to Dili to meet with the Minister of Higher Education, Dr José Honorio da Costa, the Chairman of ANAAA, Dr Azevedo Marçal, and the Director of ANAAA, Dr Nilton Paiva to receive the results of the accreditation program.

ICFP received an A grading, with the category of Excellent and a score of 91%, the highest mark in the 2023 group. The status of this A grading lasts for a period of five years, until the next formal inspection.



History of Marist Solidarity Cambodia and Lavalla School



MAKIST SOLIDARITY CAMBODIA

MSC aims to support young Cambodians with physical disabilities by way of furthering their education and assisting them into employment.





Marist Solidarity Cambodia (MSC) is an international non-governmental organisation that encompasses the LaValla Project - LaValla School, Villa Maria Hostel, LaValla Village Hostel, and an Outreach Program. MSC is an integral part of the mission of the Marist Brothers, whose founder, St Marcellin Champagnat, was committed to providing schooling for poor children from marginalised families.

That commitment and dream are being realised here in Cambodia as MSC works with underprivileged young people, especially those with disabilities. The organisation empowers these individuals by offering new and better opportunities, hoping that formal education will prove decisive in transforming their circumstances.

LaValla School, established by the Marist Brothers from Australia in Phnom Penh in 1998, is a government-approved school in Cambodia providing a full elementary school education for children and young people with physical disabilities.

An outreach program of the LaValla Project assists approximately 100 young Cambodians with physical disabilities who live at home and attend their local schools. Many of MSC's students come from rural provinces of Cambodia, and due to difficulties with travel, they are residential students.

In 2010, MSC was established to integrate various programs and sites into one entity, which we now call the **LaValla Project**, with its own Board of Directors under the aegis of the Marist Brothers' Star of the Sea Province.



MSC Board



Marist Solidarity Cambodia is an international non-governmental organisation governed by a Board of Directors on behalf of the SOTS Provincial and Council. Br Brian Kinsella is the Board Chair, and Dr Sothun Nop is the Executive Director.

The Board, including Br Allen Sherry, FMS, meets six times per year to discuss matters related to the governance of the LaValla Project.



CELEBRATING MARCELLIN CHAMPAGNAT

On 6 June every year, the LaValla Project community in Cambodia joins tens of thousands of Champagnat Marists in more than 80 countries around the world to celebrate the legacy of St Marcellin Champagnat. The stories of some of the significant parts of Marcellin's life and the forming of the Marist Brothers are retold to the younger students.





For the students and staff at LaValla School, each week starts and finishes with an assembly. The week commences in a more formal manner, with the Cambodian flag being raised, accompanied by the students singing the national anthem. One LaValla tradition for the Friday afternoon assembly is a short play performed by the members of one grade. The students eagerly involve themselves in these short plays, and the audience always anticipates a humorous end to the week.


Br Melquiano has begun by spending time supporting the LaValla music program, teaching guitar to the students. Additionally, he is also practicing basic Khmer language.

As the LaValla project is like a home for all our students, their health and well-being are our highest priorities. Every aspect of their health is attended to, including regular check-ups with dentists, specialist doctors, and optometrists.

The kids also get weekly adjustments and replacements of prosthetics with a local orthopedic NGO, a doctor on-site one day every week throughout the year, as well as daily health care provided by the MSC healthcare team, MSC staff, the Brothers, and volunteers.

FESTIVE CAMBODIA!



There are three major cultural events remembered at LaValla each year.
Khmer New Year in April, Pchhum Ben in September/October and Bon Om Touk in November.

Bon Om Touk is a tradition that is deeply rooted in Khmer culture and dates back to the 12th century.






It marks the reversal of the flow between the Mekong and Tonle Sap rivers, the end of the wet season and seeks good luck for the rice and fish harvests in the coming year.

On the evening of the second day of Bon Om Touk (Og Ambok) the LaValla community gathers to make offerings, share traditional treats of fruit, coconuts and special rice, and dance!
